The Eastern Cape experienced its longest drought in history between 2015 and 2023, lasting eight years. Thankfully, 2024 brought much-needed relief. With a semi-arid climate, periodic water scarcity and erratic rainfall, the Shamwari Foundation is actively involved in water conservation within the Reserve to sustain the diverse wildlife and ecosystems.



Threats Faced due to Water Shortages:

- Dehydration or death of precious animals
- Soil erosion and loss of essential plant life
- Increased risk of wildfires
- Reduced biodiversity

The Shamwari Foundation Combats Water Shortages by:

- Real-time, state-of-the-art borehole monitoring systems
- Ensuring sustainable usage and preventing over-extraction
- Integrated smart sensors to monitor water levels and optimise and distribution
