

General Wildlife Management

Part of ensuring a healthy and thriving game reserve is managing the variety of wildlife that call it home, and there are times when animals need to be relocated to other reserves to ensure that the land can happily sustain various species.

Capturing for Relocation:

• Every species requires a capture method unique to their needs and safety. The process can involve helicopters, darting or passive capture, using a non-lethal trapdoor enclosure. This method is time-consuming and requires physical monitoring to close the door by hand.

But, the trapdoor method remains the least stressful for animals.

What is Needed:

• Upgrade and install remote-controlled passive capture systems to streamline the process and reduce the time it takes to relocate the animals.
